Tabletop Activities

Water Painting

Need: cup of water, small paint brush, any color construction paper

Let your child dip the paint brush in water and paint the construction paper. This is a mess free, fun activity we do in school.

Sensory Bags

Fill a Ziplock bag $\frac{1}{4}$ of the way with paint, pudding, Jell-O, or even lotion. Lay it flat on the table and let your child use their finger to draw shapes and lines in the substance you placed in the bag. You don’t need to put in much and make sure the air is out in it. I would not recommend leaving your child unattended during this activity since the bags can be easily opened.

Shaving Cream Table

Squirt a generous amount of shaving cream on the table and let your child wipe it all over the table. This activity is best to do outside on a picnic table so it can be easily cleaned when they are finished. Be sure your child does not put the shaving cream in their mouth.

Energy Burning Games


Dance Party

Toilet Paper Snakes
